The Maine Association of Psychiatric Physicians (MAPP) works toward a future in which there is no mental illness, because high quality psychiatric diagnosis and treatment is available to all individuals and their families, and psychiatrists are connected and supported professionally. We do this by advancing the treatment, rehabilitation, and care of persons with mental disorders; advocating for the professional interests of psychiatrists; providing educational opportunities for clinicians, patients, and the public; and building a strong and supportive community among our members.

In partnership with the American Psychiatric Association (APA) and the Maine Medical Association (MMA), we have strength in numbers at the legislature. Your support enables MAPP to advocate for your profession and your patients. In 2020, MAPP was instrumental in leading the way towards the expansion of telehealth. In 2017 MAPP presented an anti-MOC bill that states MOC cannot be used for licensure of physicians. Members of MAPP are currently working on a bill to be introduced in the 2023 legislative session that will specify that carriers shall not use conditional reimbursement, network admission status, contracting, or credentialing status on participation in a maintenance of certification program by a physician.
